The Lower School Student Council prepares students for leadership roles on campus. They host family events on campus including Donuts with Dad in October, Grandparents Day in February and normally Muffins with Mom in May. Unfortunately, Muffins with Mom was cancelled due to the Coronavirus.

Some of the field trips LS Student Council attended this year were the historical Flagler Museum where they learned about Flagler's contributions to the development of Florida through his companies and railroad. Next they visited Lakeside Medical Center where students were hands on in the lab as they viewed blood and other specimens under the microscope. They learned that working in healthcare means so much more than doctors and nurses.

New this year, was the trip to **Florida Crystals** for a hands-on, interactive, educational presentation at their facility. They toured and explored equipment used in the farm industry and visited the highly advanced laboratory in which they are experimenting and studying the growth of sugar cane in a new way. Students were shown how drone pilots are employed by the company to fly over crops with high resolution lens and cameras, as well as specific filters to look for disease, pests, etc. In the greenhouse, students transplanted very small plants into larger containers. ## VARSITY BASEBALL


Our record was 6-2 and we were playing very good baseball! We had fun and were in serious contention for a District Championship run.
